INTRODUCTION

As a police organization, the gathering and analyzing of statistical data is vital to police organizations. Statistics are necessary for overall police operations and form the basis of how we do our job and utilize resources. The Royal Newfoundland Constabulary's (RNC) Annual Juristat Report presents information on the short and long-term crime trends, violent and non-violent crime, at the provincial level within RNC Jurisdiction (Northeast Avalon, Corner Brook, and Labrador). Police-reported crime statistics represent one way to measure the nature and extent of crime in RNC jurisdiction.

Data on incidents that come to the attention of police are captured and forwarded to the Canadian Criminal Justice Statistics (CCJS) according to a nationally approved set of common scoring rules and definitions. The reader should note, however, that many factors could influence official crime statistics. These include reporting by the public to the police, reporting by police to the CCJS, and the impact of new initiative such as changes in legislation, policies or enforcement policies (Source: CCJS).

Acts that are chargeable under the *Canadian Criminal Code* are classified as criminal acts or 'crimes'. Examples of these acts include assault, mischief, and theft of vehicle. These acts are recorded using a police-reporting system and available for statistical and criminal review and analysis for the purpose of the RNC Annual Juristat Report. To provide a complete analytical review of police-reported data, a strategic analysis approach was utilized. Strategic crime analysis is concerned with operational strategies and provides information for resource allocation purposes. Its purpose is to identify unusual crime activities over certain periods of time and to provide police services more effectively and assist in community policing.

When an amendment to the *Criminal Code* creates a new offence or broadens the definition of an existing offence, the number of incidents reported to police will likely increase. This report is produced to demonstrate the scale, number and nature of recorded crimes offences and incidents within RNC Jurisdictions. It is intended for current topics of interest to the justice and public community and provides a detailed analysis of statistics on numerous topics and issues concerning RNC crimes rates.

DATA SOURCES

To capture the calls for service that are being received by the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, an in-house computer system called ICAN (Integrated Constabulary Automated Network) is used. Part of the ICAN network is composed of RMS (Records Management System) and CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch). Geographical Information Systems (GIS) technologies are used to "map crime" as a tool to assist and enhance problem solving and intelligence lead policing. To capture victim information, gender, and classification an in-house computer system called Report Warehouse is used.

The RNC 2017 Annual Juristat Report was prepared by the Information Services Division. Statistical data provided in the 2017 Annual Report is based on data uploaded on May 16, 2018. Please note that statistical data may change due to ongoing investigations, data review, and data quality.

ANOMALIES

In 2017, there was a change in UCR codes relating to violations involving exploited persons, in congruency with the UCR adoption of Bill C-36: An Act to amend the Criminal Code in response to the Supreme Court of Canada decision in Attorney General of Canada v. Bedford and to make consequential amendments to other Acts. Additionally, in 2017, two new UCR codes were introduced for opioid violations other than heroin.

In 2018, there was a change in UCR codes relating to violations involving cannabis legalization, as well as impaired driving, in congruency with the UCR adoption of Bill C-46: An Act to amend the Criminal Code. As well, in January, following collaboration with the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police and the Police Information and Statistics Committee, a new definition of unfounded was established by the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics. Further, it was determined that the lack of specificity in reasons for not clearing an incident may have contributed to varying rates of unfounded incidences. It became evident that more options were needed in order for police to report more accurately and to produce a better statistical understanding of the reason why founded incidents may not be cleared. Based on consultations, it was recommended that the classification of 'not cleared' be separated into three new types of categories.






FIGURE 2: 2014-2018 Reported Sexual Assaults

FIGURE 4: 2014 - 2018 ROBBERIES BY CLASSIFICATION





FIGURE 5: 2018 BREAK AND ENTER BY CLASSIFICATION




FIGURE 6: 2014 - 2018 BREAK AND ENTER





FIGURE 7: 2013-2017 MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT





FIGURE 8: 2018 COLLISIONS BY CLASSIFICATION



FIGURE 9: 2018 COLLISIONS BY DISTRICT



MAP 5: 2017 MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISIONS, NORTHEAST AVALON


