INTRODUCTION

As a police organization, the gathering and analyzing of statistical data is vital to police organizations. Statistics are necessary for overall police operations and form the basis of how we do our job and utilize resources. The Royal Newfoundland Constabulary's (RNC) Annual Juristat Report presents information on the short and long-term crime trends, violent and non-violent crime, at the provincial level within RNC Jurisdiction (Northeast Avalon, Corner Brook, and Labrador). Police-reported crime statistics represent one way to measure the nature and extent of crime in RNC jurisdiction.

Data on incidents that come to the attention of police are captured and forwarded to the Canadian Criminal Justice Statistics (CCJS) according to a nationally approved set of common scoring rules and definitions. The reader should note, however, that many factors could influence official crime statistics. These include reporting by the public to the police, reporting by police to the CCJS, and the impact of new initiative such as changes in legislation, policies or enforcement policies (Source: CCJS).

Acts that are chargeable under the *Canadian Criminal Code* are classified as criminal acts or 'crimes'. Examples of these acts include assault, mischief, and theft of vehicle. These acts are recorded using a police-reporting system and available for statistical and criminal review and analysis for the purpose of the RNC Annual Juristat Report. To provide a complete analytical review of police-reported data, a strategic analysis approach was utilized. Strategic crime analysis is concerned with operational strategies and provides information for resource allocation purposes. Its purpose is to identify unusual crime activities over certain periods of time and to provide police services more effectively and assist in community policing.

When an amendment to the *Criminal Code* creates a new offence or broadens the definition of an existing offence, the number of incidents reported to police will likely increase. This report is produced to demonstrate the scale, number and nature of recorded crimes offences and incidents within RNC Jurisdictions. It is intended for current topics of interest to the justice and public community and provides a detailed analysis of statistics on numerous topics and issues concerning RNC crimes rates.

DATA SOURCES

To capture the calls for service that are being received by the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, an in-house computer system called ICAN (Integrated Constabulary Automated Network) is used. Part of the ICAN network is composed of RMS (Records Management System) and CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch). Geographical Information Systems (GIS) technologies are used to "map crime" as a tool to assist and enhance problem solving and intelligence lead policing. To capture victim information, gender, and classification an in-house computer system called Report Warehouse is used.

The RNC 2025 Annual Juristat Report was prepared by the Information Services Division. Statistical data provided in the 2025 Annual Report is based on data uploaded on January 22, 2026. Please note that statistical data may change due to ongoing investigations, data review, and data quality.

ANOMALIES

- The new recommended standard, “sexual orientation of person”, pertains to how an individual describes their sexuality. Under this standard, individuals may report their sexual orientation by selecting one of: “heterosexual (i.e., straight)”, “lesbian or gay”, “bisexual or pansexual”, or by providing another term in a write-in field. The new standard will help the agency address information gaps on Canada’s 2SLGBTQ+ population. Statistics Canada will incorporate the new sexual orientation standard into several surveys and will continue this implementation going forward. In response to this change, CCJCSS has updated certain terminology in relation to sexual orientation. The changes are listed below and have been applied to the hate crime variables accordingly: LGBT changed to 2sLGBTQI+ and Gender Diverse changed to Non-Binary.
- The Canadian Government granted royal assent to Bill S-223: An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (Trafficking in Human Organs), on December 15, 2022. The enactment of Bill S-223 amends the Criminal Code to create new offences in relation to trafficking in human organs, among other changes. Effective December 15, 2022, sections 240.1(1) Removal without informed consent and 240.1(2) financial transaction became punishable offences under the Criminal Code.
- In order to align with the Canadian 2021 Census, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) modified existing gender code labels in the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey. Option labels within the variables victim gender and charged/suspect chargeable gender were modified accordingly; F – Female was changed to F – Woman, M – Male changed to M - Man and D - Gender Diverse will changed to D - Non-binary. Please note that there was change to the codes used (F, M and D) these are changes to the label associated with each code only.
- On account of Joint Forces Operations with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Controlled Drugs and Substances charges undertaken through the RCMP but occurring within RNC jurisdiction in Corner Brook are reflected in this report. This is taken into consideration in effort to align with Statistics Canada’s reporting on crime statistics. Affected statistics are marked with an * on page 14 of this report.

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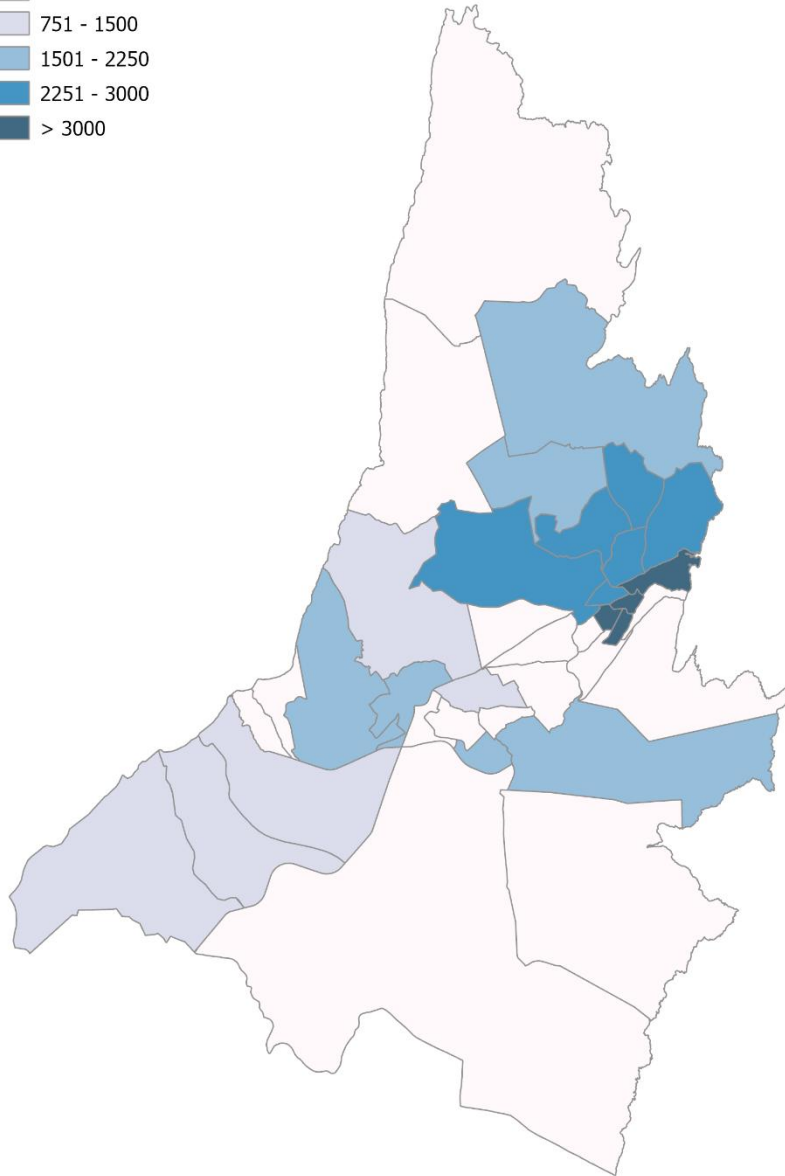
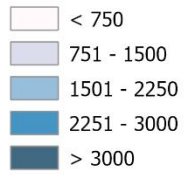

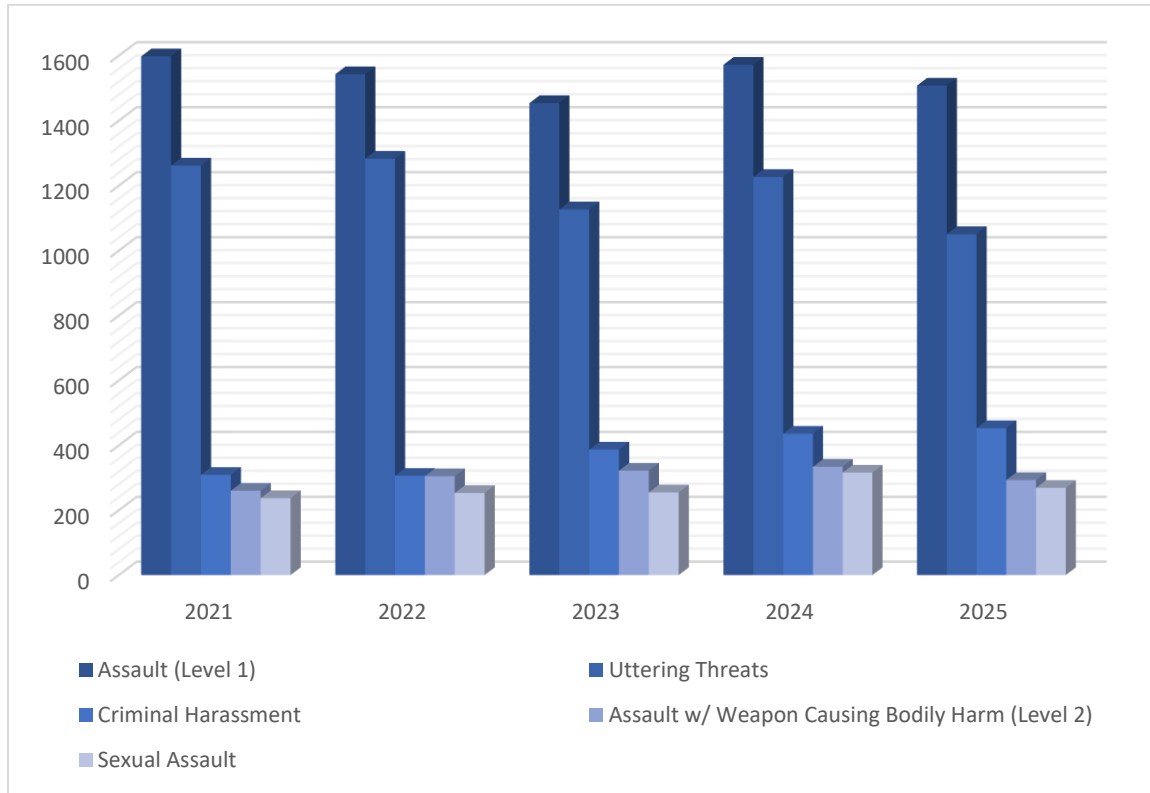

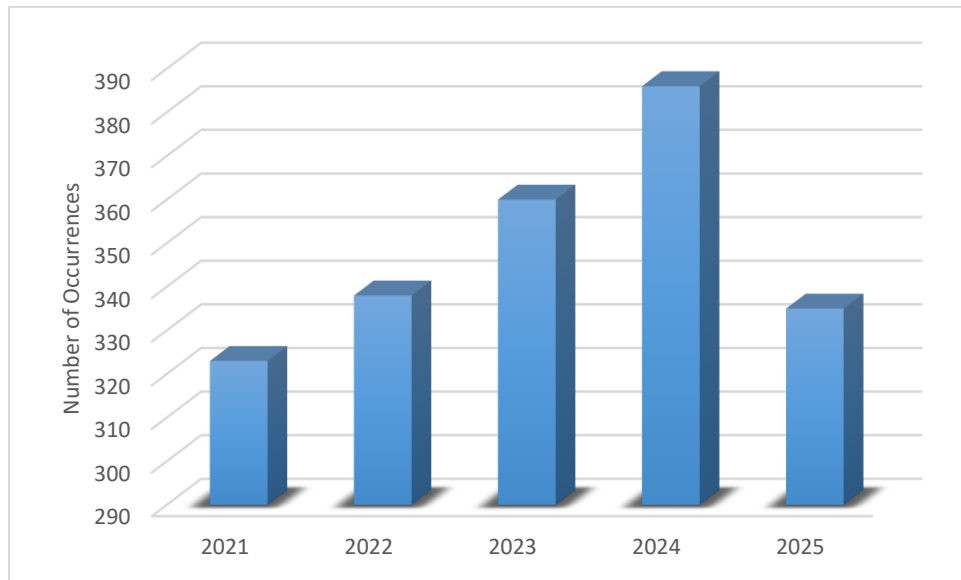

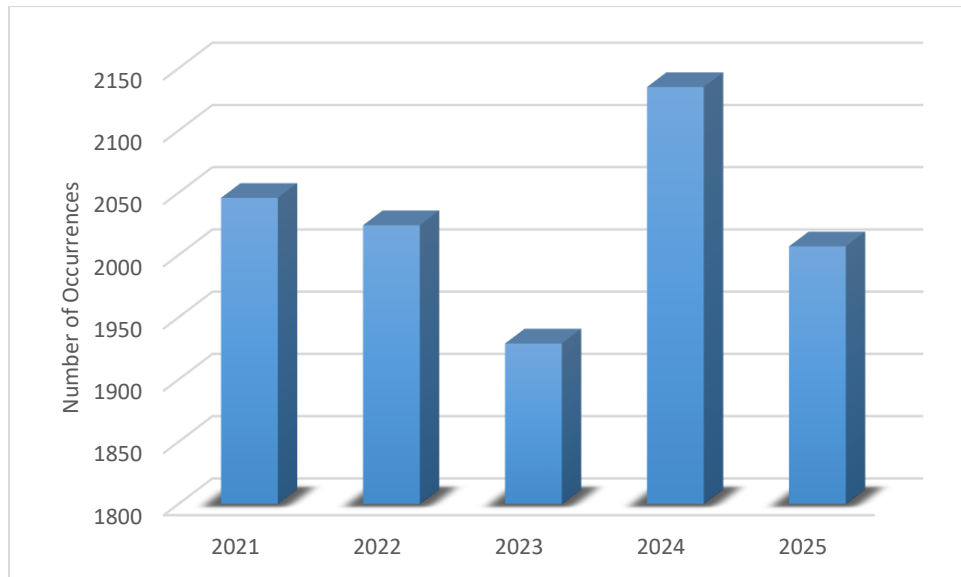
FIGURE 2: 2021 - 2025 Reported Sexual Assaults

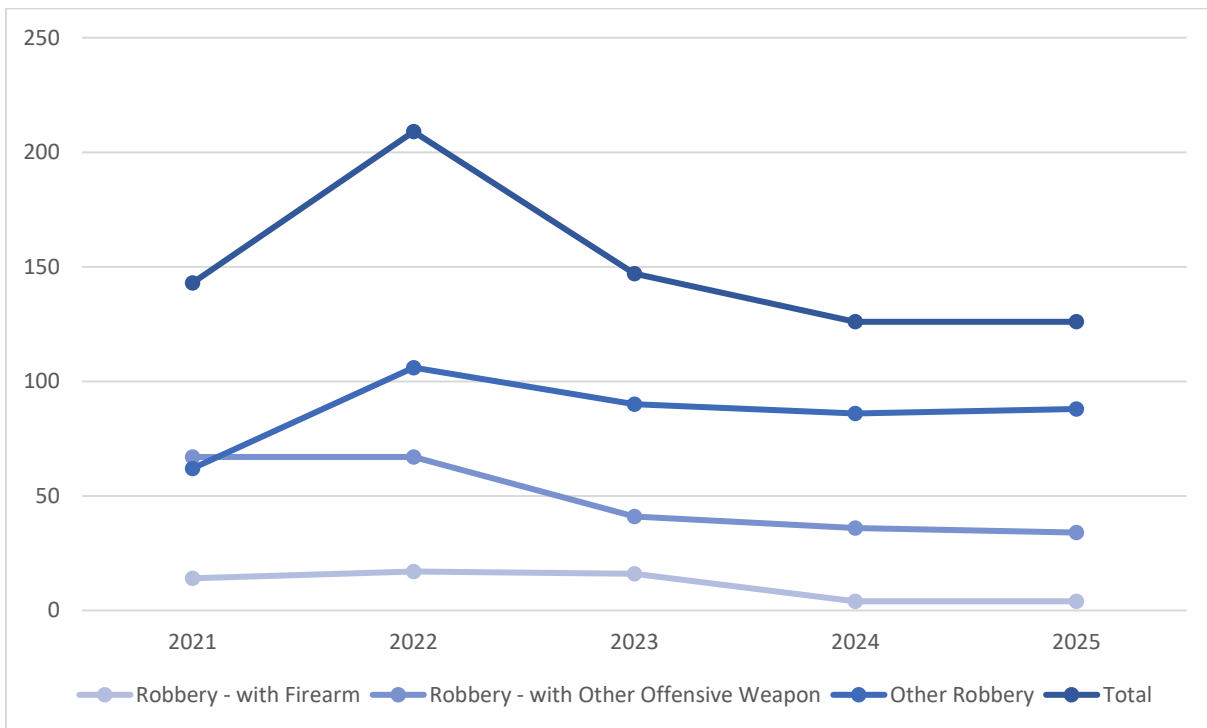
FIGURE 4: 2021 - 2025 ROBBERIES BY CLASSIFICATION

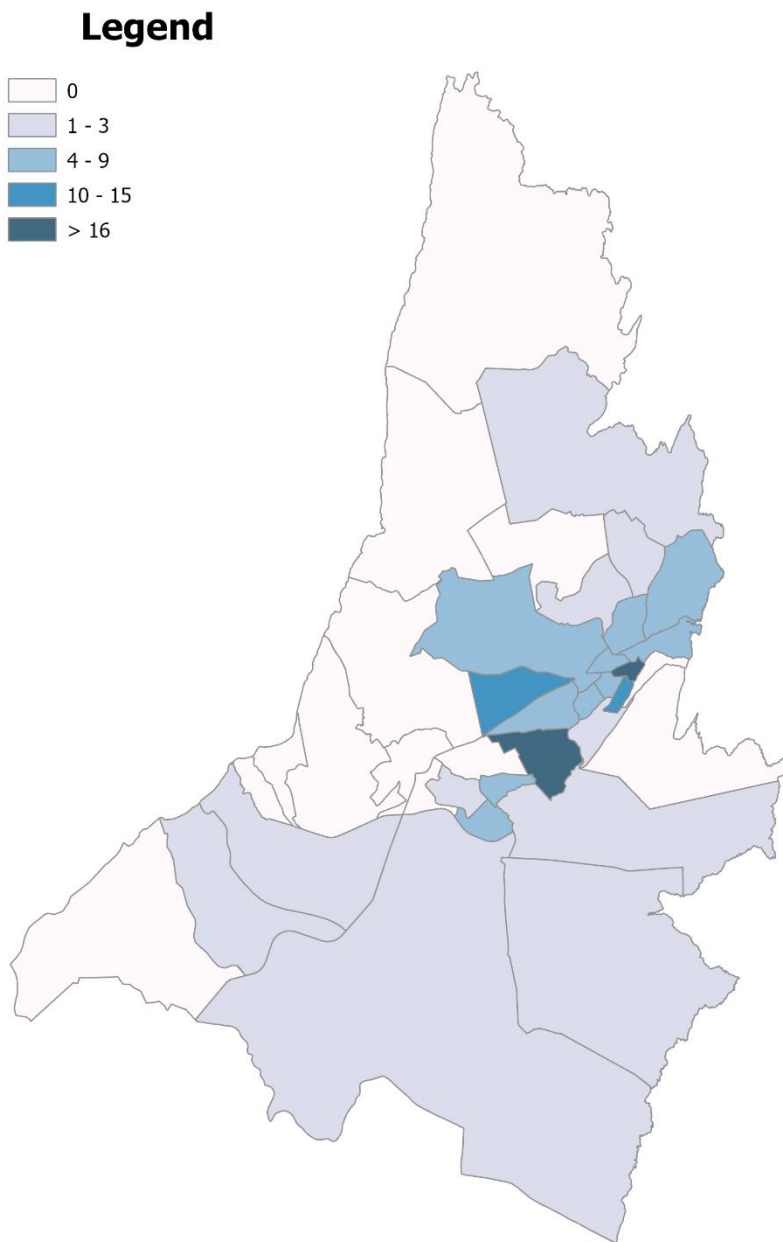

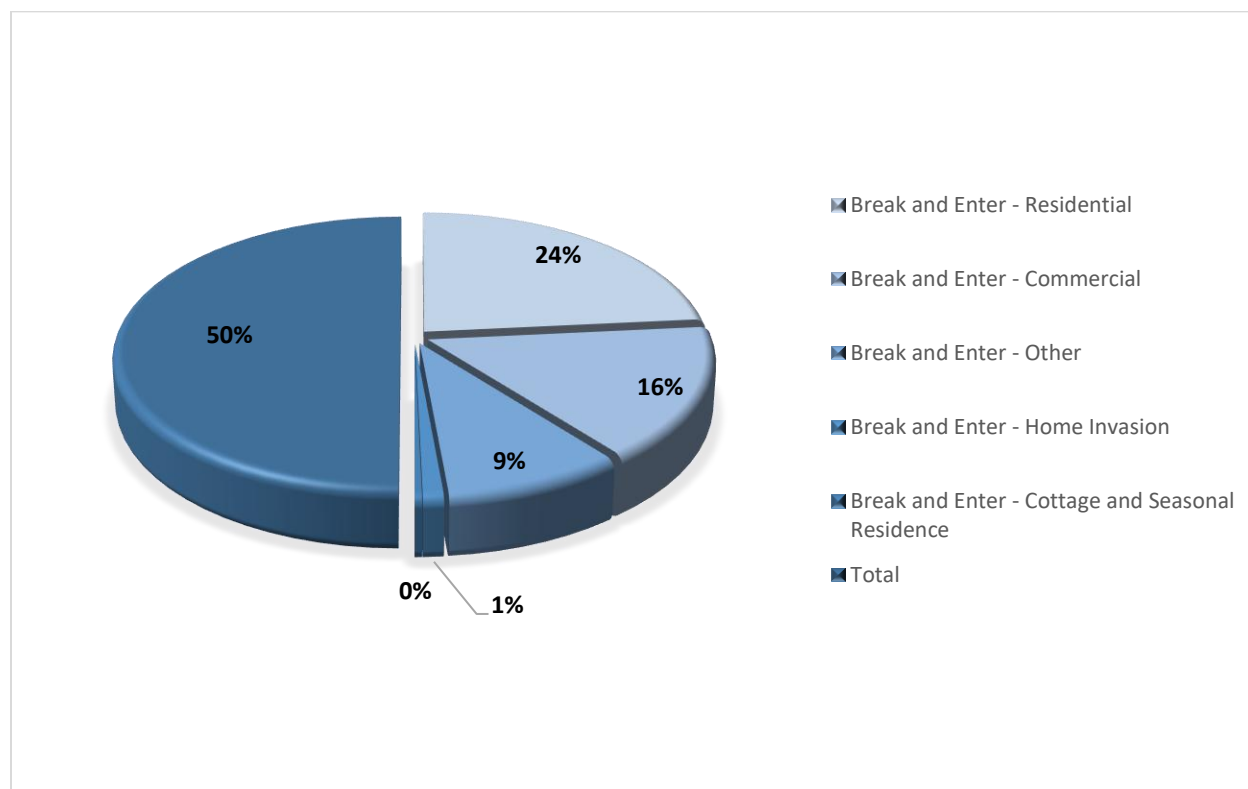
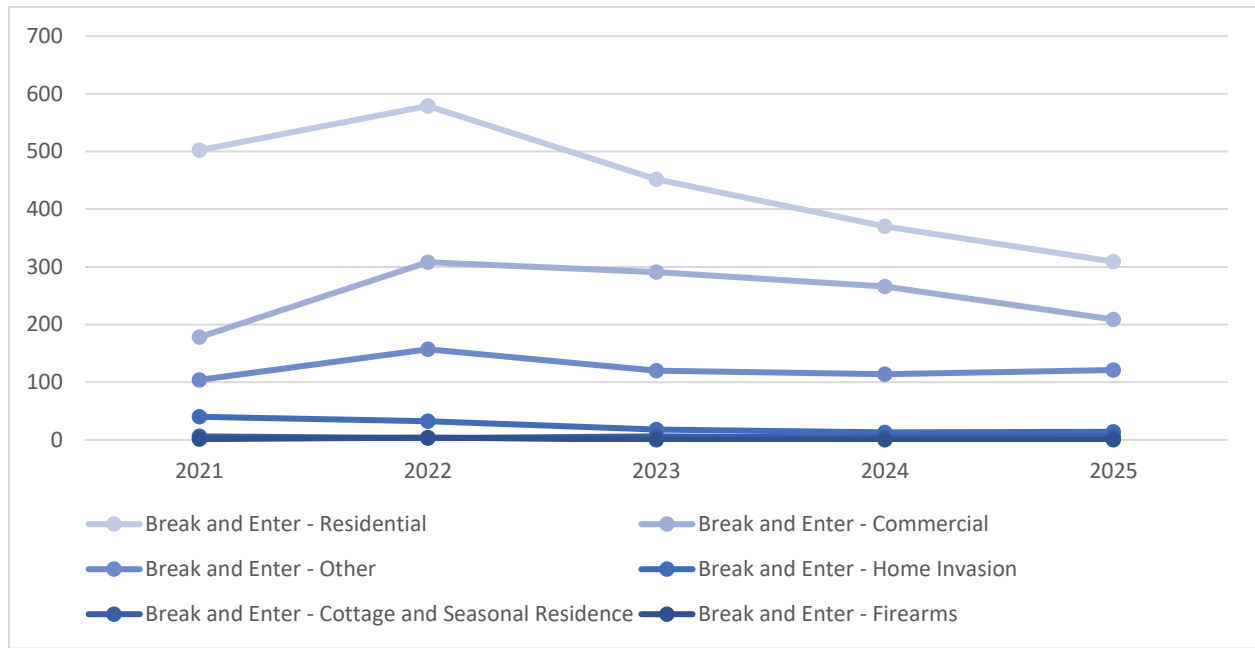
FIGURE 5: 2025 BREAK AND ENTER BY CLASSIFICATION

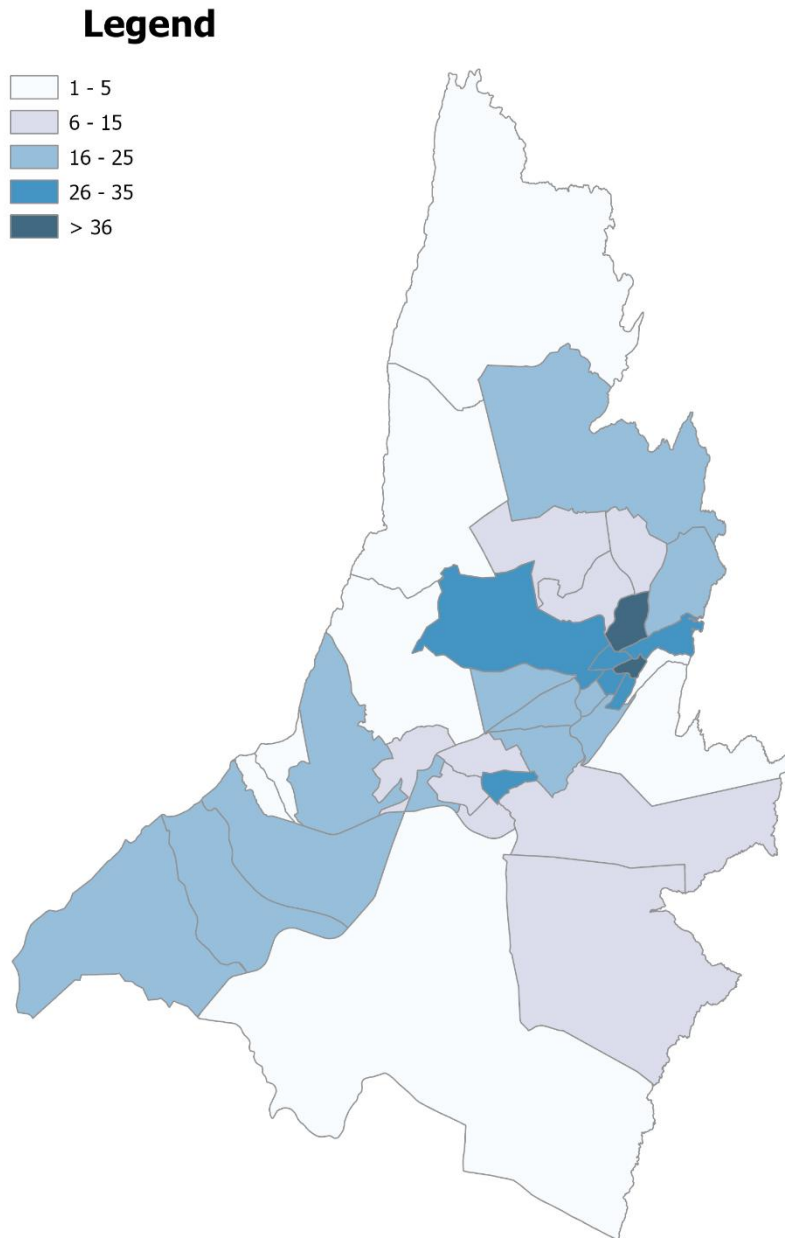

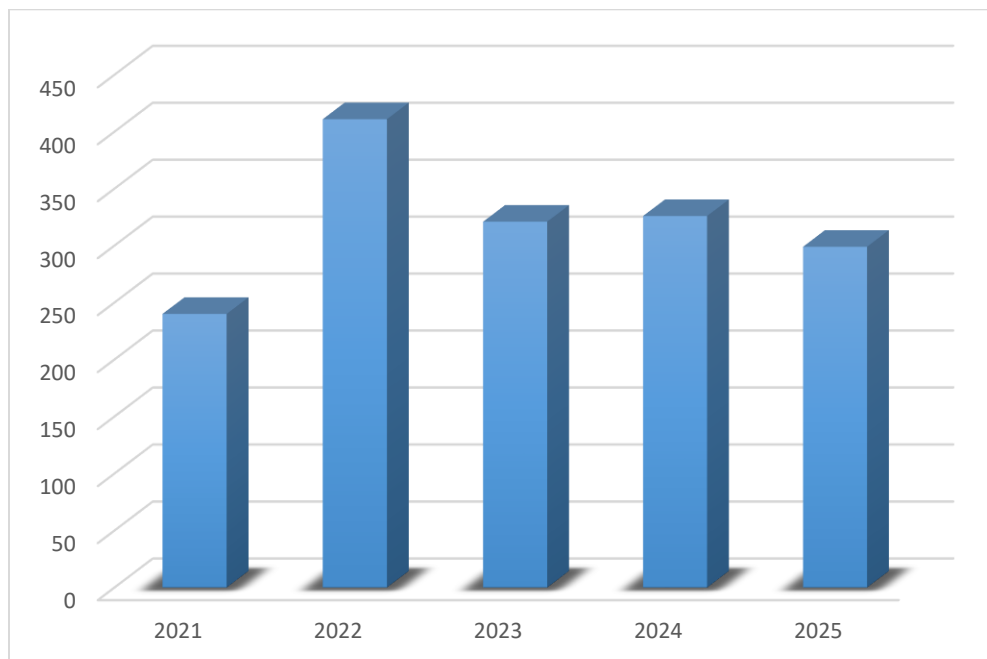

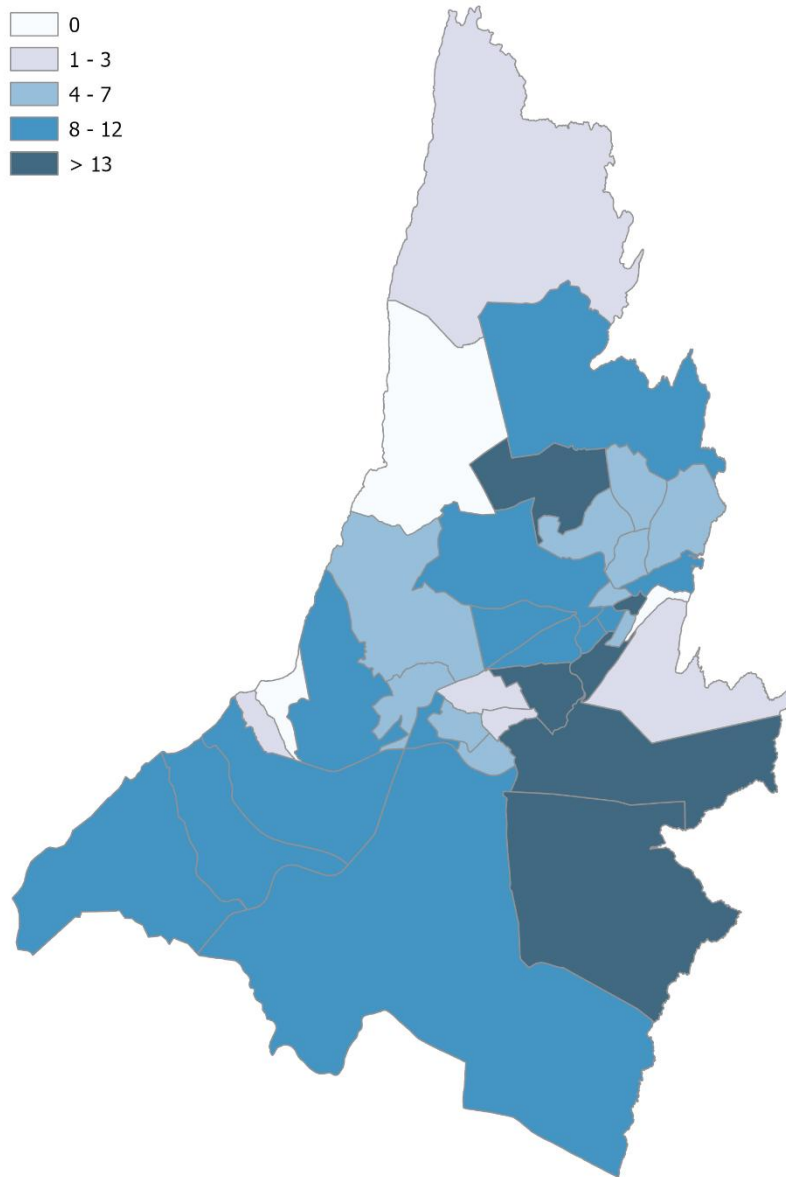

MAP 4: 2025 MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT, NORTHEAST AVALON



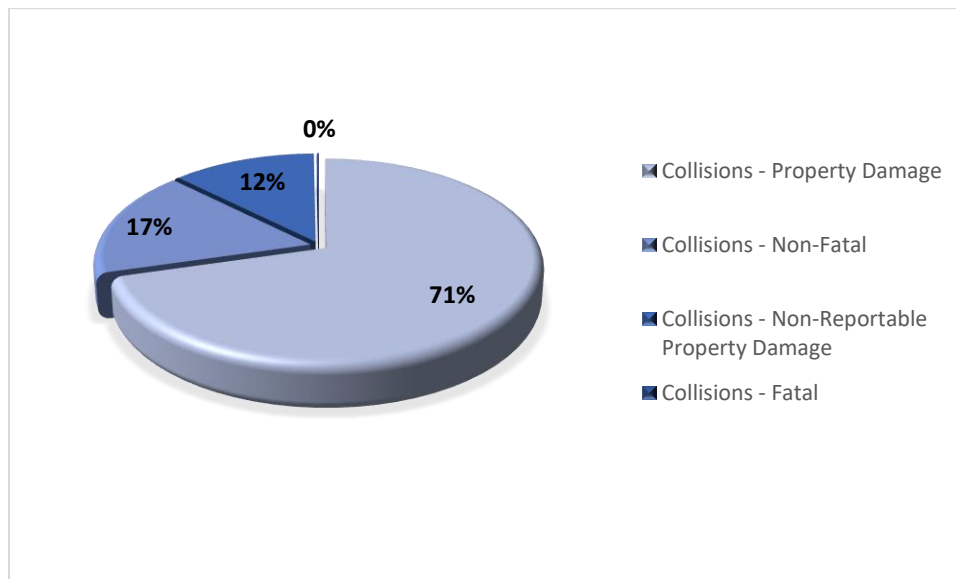

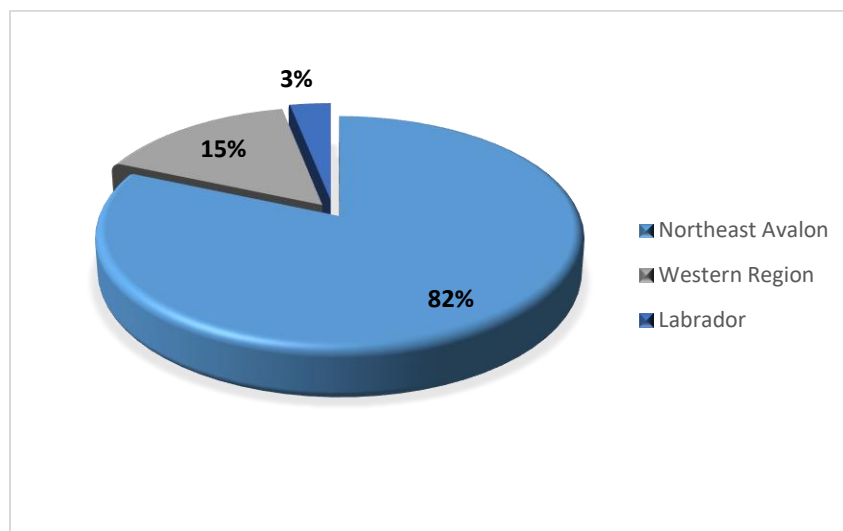

MAP 5: 2025 MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISIONS, NORTHEAST AVALON

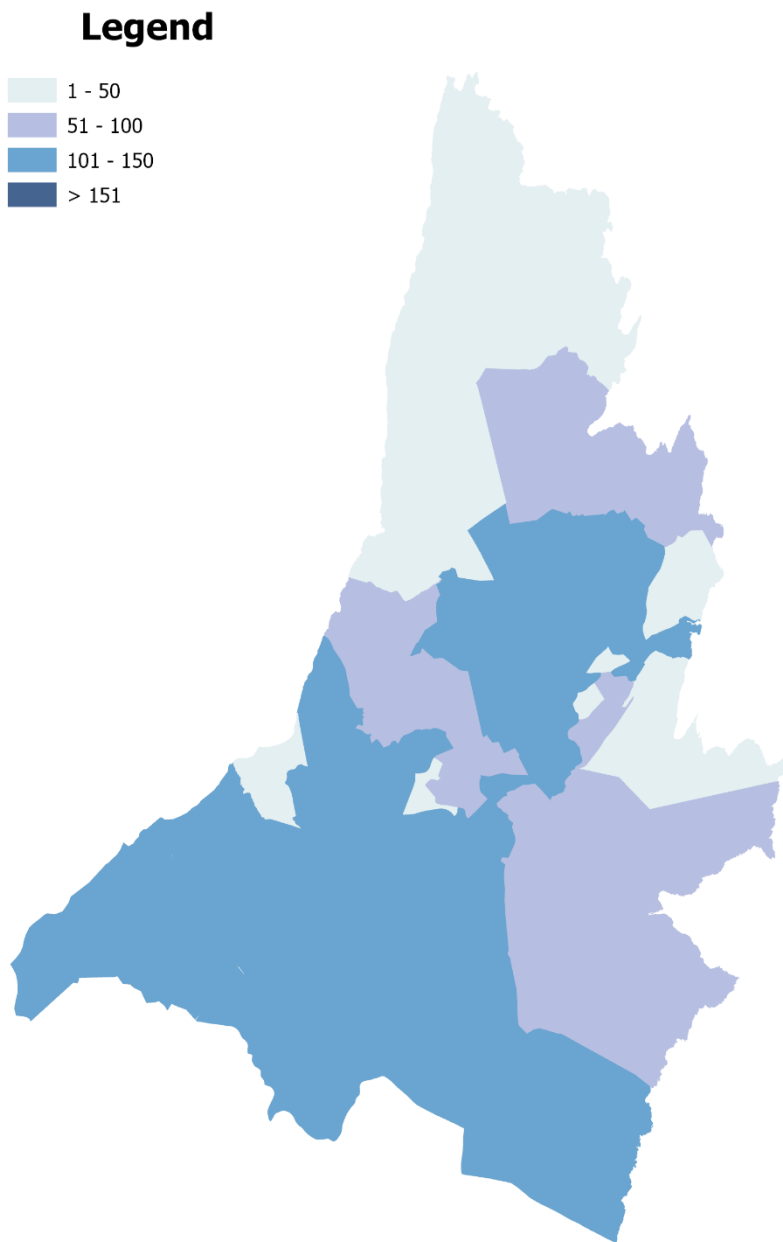
